Jakob Fichert presents a concert of music curated by Tom Armstrong, composer and York University alumnus, consisting of a tapestry of variations — four discreet panels threading together variation works from the 19th to the 21st centuries. The musical sources Tom and Jakob have chosen range from variations on well known themes to rarely performed works or pieces by unjustly overlooked composers. Tom's memory of associations between his own *Dance Maze* and Aaron Copland's *Variations* was the catalyst for this project and this pairing forms the first panel. Thereafter Tom and Jakob have ordered the panels to gradually move towards tonality before veering into the modal and chromatic worlds of Bartók and Leighton to finish.
